The Iowa PGA Foundation annually awards a college scholarship in memory of Iowa Golf Hall of Famer, Charlie Burkart, PGA member for 49 years and head professional at the Elmcrest Country Club in Cedar Rapids for 42 years. The purpose of the scholarship is to assist students in furthering their education. At least one high school graduate will be the 2024 recipient of \$1500 per year for four years. Other previously graduated applicants will be reviewed with additional scholarships awarded when possible, for one year \$1,000 scholarship.

Any graduating high school senior or previous graduate residing within the boundaries of the Iowa PGA Foundation and the State of Iowa is eligible to apply. The Iowa PGA Foundation is bounded on the west by U.S. Highway 71 and includes an area of western Illinois from a point north of Quincy, east to near Springfield and directly north. It includes the major cities of Monmouth, Macomb, Galesburg, Moline, Rock Island, Kewanee and Galena. It does not include the cities of Freeport, Springfield or Quincy.

Scholarship winners are selected on the basis of their interest and activity in golf, the potential for future contributions to the game, leadership skills/community involvement, then on their academic/professional ability and financial need.

Burkart applicants are required to submit the following when applying for the \$1,500 per year for four years scholarship.

- 1. High school transcript of work completed and description of any post-secondary academic achievement.
- 2. Two recommendations may be from a high school administrator or teacher, a PGA professional or other non-family connections.
- 3. Applicant must include a self-statement concerning his/her interest in golf, other activities and awards, his/her educational and vocational plans/career goals and financial need.
- 4. Applicant is requested to send a list of other scholarship they have applied for and those that they have received.
